



Notice of Geotechnical Exploration Work near Gross Reservoir

Denver Water will begin geotechnical exploration on U.S. Forest Service (USFS) property adjacent to Gross Reservoir within the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission boundary in early September to assess the potential for producing concrete sand and gravel for the Gross Reservoir Expansion Project. We sent a letter of notification in March to let you know we submitted our permit request and wanted to follow up to inform you that we have obtained the permit from USFS for this work. The USFS did not require a public comment period for the permit.

The onsite exploration is expected to be complete in November. The material samples collected from the test bores will then be evaluated over the following months to assess the potential for producing concrete from onsite materials.

We expect the exploration work to create minimal disturbance to the area. A map showing the site is posted at www.denverwater.org/moffat under “Document Library.” A site visit with our engineers can also be arranged for nearby property owners.
