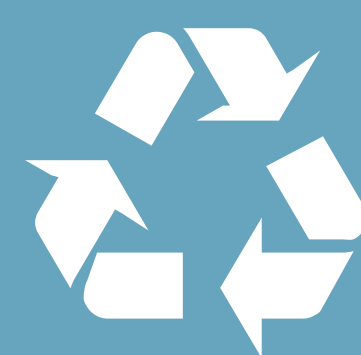

Long-term benefits
